Dear Parents/Guardians:

The safety of our children is of top priority for all of us. We, the Good Spirit School Division (GSSD) and Christ the Teacher Catholic Schools (CTTCS), are involved in intensive safety training with our community partners. Together, we developed a plan for responding to high-risk behaviours. High-risk behaviours include, but are not limited to, possession of weapons, bomb threats and threats to injure oneself or others.

This letter is to inform you that GSSD/CTTCS school systems have a policy that requires principals to initiate a "threat assessment" in all cases of students displaying any type of high-risk behaviour. Should you wish to review the "Administrative Procedure 165: Safe Schools" or "Administrative Procedure 354: Threat Assessment", please visit our websites at either www.gssd.ca or www.christtheteacher.ca. The purpose of these assessments is to determine how best to support high-risk students so that their behaviour does not become hurtful or destructive. If your child comes home and tells you that a student has behaved in a threatening way at school, please advise your principal and be assured that your principal will be taking measures to deal with the situation in a positive and proactive manner. If your principal invites you to a meeting to discuss safety concerns about your own child, please be assured that the procedure is being followed and that the primary goal is safety, not punishment.

This letter is intended to serve our community with fair notice that we, as school communities, will not accept "no response" to a serious threat. Our goal is to respond to all threats in a professional manner that provides for a healthy and caring learning environment.

We are pleased to provide, in conjunction with our community partners, a safe environment for all of our students.

Before and After School Procedures

Before School

- ☑ Children should arrive at school as close to 8:45 as possible.
- Children place their backpacks inside and then head outdoors for recess. Staff supervisors are on duty beginning at 8:35.

After School

Bus students will depart classrooms first to get on their bus.



- Rural and City bus students are dismissed at 3:25 to safely board their buses.
- All other students are dismissed from their classrooms at 3:30. If they are being picked up, they will meet their family members outside.

The drop-off area in front of the school is for buses only. Please refrain from using it to drop-off or pickup your children at the beginning and end of the day. Parking is available on the west side of Main Street or on the two sides of the school. Please help ensure safety by having your child use the crosswalks!

Our students play outside at recess and also participate in physical education outside when weather permits. Please note that it is best if they have shoes that they can run safely in. We want our students to have as much safe, physical activity as possible. Thanks for your assistance.

All parents and visitors are required to enter through the main doors, ring the bell and wait until a staff member greets you before proceeding further into the school. Thank you for helping us follow these safety practices.

SCHOOL FIRE SAFETY

École St. Henry's Jr. School has a comprehensive plan for responding to various emergencies, such as fire, weather emergencies, and dangerous situations. The plan is reviewed annually by the staff and practiced with the students. During the course of the year, our staff and students will practice 6 fire drills (in addition to practice walk-throughs and sounding the alarms), 2 relocations, 4 lockdowns, and 1 tornado drill. In case of an evacuation of the school building, students will leave the school and move to the playground area. For safety reasons, we stress the importance of "no talking" and "not covering their ears" so that they are able to hear teacher directions. If it is not safe to return to the building, we will relocate to St. Henry's Church. In the case of an emergency, parents will be contacted by a phone call.

A reminder that we are a PEANUT-and-Nut-free school as well as PERFUME-free. Please refrain from sending food containing peanuts or nuts for snack or lunch. Several students and staff have a severe allergy which could cause anaphylactic reaction, which could result in death. Thank you for your consideration!

Southland City Bus

Our city bus provider is currently using our route from last year. We will be sending out a survey in the next few days to help provide updated location information from families. The bus company will use this information to update seating plans and modify routes. Once the new route is ready we will provide further details to families.

Families it is of utmost importance that you call the school if your child will be away for any reason. Ms. Bartake and Mrs. Adams look forward to connecting with you during these phone calls. Please call 306-728-4758 to notify the school of an absence.
